Eligibility:

- 1) Candidates eligible for selection to this chapter must
 - a) be in the second semester of their seventh or eighth grade year
 - b) must have been enrolled for a period equivalent to one semester at Memorial Middle School.
 - c) shall have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.75 on a 4.0 scale.
- 2) Upon meeting the grade level, enrollment, and GPA standards, candidates shall then be considered based on their service, leadership, character, and citizenship.

Requirements as a member

- 1) Members will
 - a) Maintain a 3.75 GPA
 - b) Participate in at least one group service project (will have multiple opportunities)
 - c) Complete at least one individual service project in the membership year.
 - d) Pay membership dues Annual dues \$10 to be paid no later than by the first Friday of the induction ceremony
 - e) Attend regular meetings of this chapter which shall be every other month starting in September (September, November, January, March, and May) Special meetings can be called by the president with approval of the adviser.
